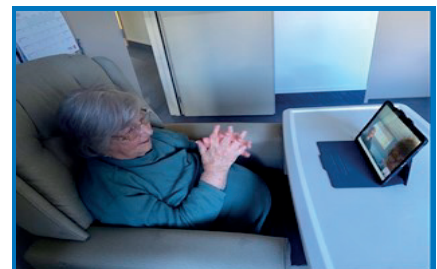
This made a huge difference to both the residents and their family members.

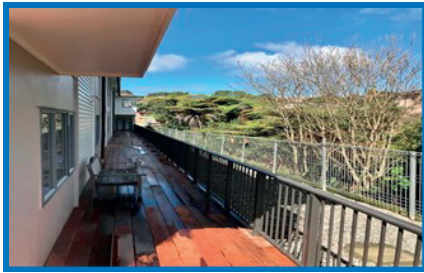
